1 Hanamiyama Park [MAP E-1]



A renowned paradise of flowers in Fukushima. This park is a famous spot for viewing flowers, and was described by late photographer Shotoru Akiyama as a "paradise in Fukushima." Tourists come from across the country to see the flowers in bloom.

Flowers bloom! Early April - early May

2 Bandai-Azuma Skyline [MAP C-1]



Beautiful panoramas while driving above the clouds. This scenic, mountainous road weaves throughout the Azuma Mountains. It offers things to see in every season, including snow corridors in the spring and foliage in the autumn.

3 Bandai Highland [MAP C-2]



A resort blessed with famous mountains, lakes, marshes, and hot springs. The natural world of the Bandai Highland is perfect for outdoor activities, including the highland, lakes, marshes, and famous mountains. Here, you can experience untouched nature.

4 Koriyama City Fureai Science Center Spacepark [MAP D-3]



Experience the appeal of space. This urban science museum on the theme of space occupies the 20th to 24th floors of Big-1, a high-rise building at the West Exit of JR Koriyama Station.

5 Abukuma Cave [MAP F-4]



A beautiful cave in the natural world. This 600-meter-long cave contains various types of stalactites, said to be of the largest number and variety in Asia.

6 Licca Castle [MAP E-4]



Make your own Licca-chan! This is Japan's only open factory for the integrated production of Licca-chan dolls. It also features Licca-chan exhibitions and dresses to rent.

7 Sukagawa Peony Garden [MAP D-4]



Large, gorgeous peonies in full bloom. This park, three times larger than Tokyo Dome, has 7,000 peony bushes of 290 varieties.

Flowers bloom! Early April - early May

8 Angel Forest NasuShirakawa [MAP C-4]



Enjoy nature with your dog. This resort complex offers facilities and services that you can enjoy together with your dog, including cottages, camp sites, hot springs, and activities.

9 Shirakawa Komine-jo Castle [MAP C-5]



The famous castle of the Oshu checkpoint, with its gorgeous three-story yagura and complete stone walls. The site of fierce fighting during the Boshin War. The castle was built by the Shirakawa branch of the Yuki clan during the Northern and Southern Courts period. Designated as a National Historic Site.

10 Aizu Tsuruga-jo Castle [MAP B-3]



A famous, impregnable castle with beautiful red tiles. This castle, the symbol of Aizuwakamatsu City, has ties to Nijima Yae and was the site of the Byakkoutai tragedy. It withstood a one-month siege during the Boshin War.

11 Ouchijuku [MAP B-4]

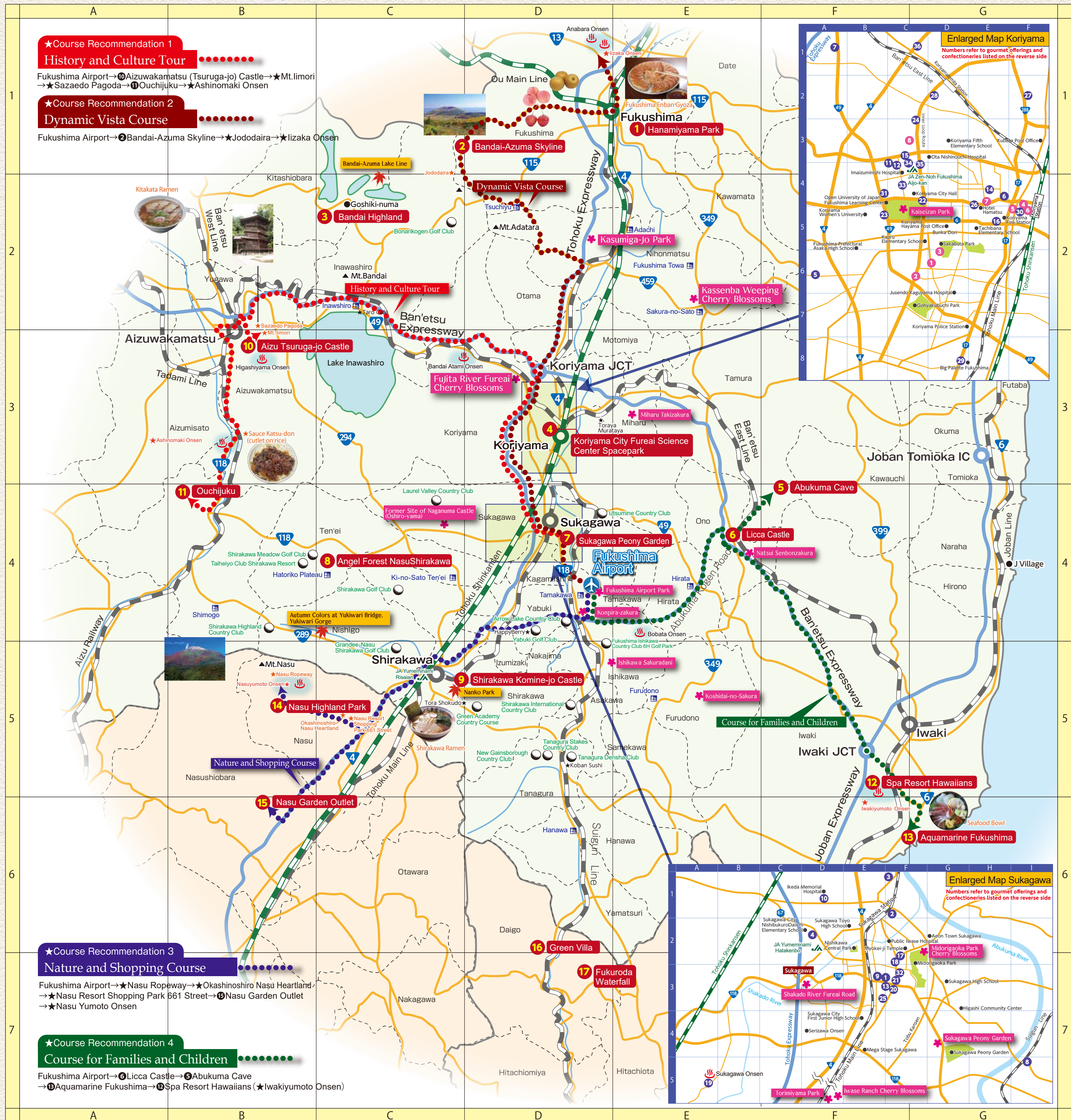


A former post town with a historical atmosphere. This former post town preserves the scenery of the Edo Period, with thatched-roof homes along both sides of the old road.

12 Spa Resort Hawaiians [MAP F-5]



A summer paradise with hula girls. This hot-spring theme park is fun all year round, including pools, Onsen, hula girl shows, and golf.



Fukushima Prefecture is situated in the southernmost part of the Tohoku region, about 200 km from Tokyo. In terms of area, it is the third-largest prefecture after Hokkaido and Iwate Prefecture. It is divided into the three areas of Hamadori, Nakadori, and Aizu, each featuring very different climates. Blessed with natural abundance in the form of oceans, mountains, and lakes, it is also known as the Kingdom of Fruit, and the Onsen Paradise.



Don't miss the enormous Current Rip tanks! This aquarium re-creates the living environments of plants and animals. Visitors can see, touch, discover, and learn about the oceans.

13 Aquamarine Fukushima [MAP F-6]



A large amusement park known for its 10 large roller coasters. This amusement park is the largest in the northern Kanto region and features 10 roller coasters to enjoy. It also holds a wide range of limited-time and collaborative events.

14 Nasu Highland Park [MAP B-5]



Find Nasu souvenirs here! In addition to fashion and outdoor shops, this outlet is home to the appealing Loco Market that sells Nasu specialty items, highland vegetables, and dairy products.

15 Nasu Garden Outlet [MAP B-6]



You can enjoy a wide range of outdoor leisure activities. One of the most popular auto campgrounds in eastern Japan, where you will be able to fully enjoy the outdoors by taking advantage of our heated pool, tennis courts, sliders, and more in the midst of in Okukoji's natural and cultural surroundings.

16 Green Villa [MAP D-6]



Enjoy this waterfall in all four seasons. This waterfall, 120 meters tall and 73 meters wide, is one of Japan's Three Famous Falls. It freezes and turns into an icefall in the winter.
